Based on true events, the movie is the story of Jim Ellis, a teacher who changed lives forever when he founded an African American swim team in a rough neighborhood of Philadelphia. One reviewer said, "It shows how an ordinary man can do something extraordinary."

ACEH president Marvin Younger, who grew up in Philadelphia, said, "This is a terrific film that merges the realities of living in the ghetto with and without hope for the future. It's a gripping story of survival, in a world where all the cards are stacked against you."

"Pride" is an hour and 50 minutes long and rated PG. ACEH will provide pizza for the evening.
