

Faith, inner faith and interfaith are focus of ACEH meeting

For its first get-together of the new decade, the Alliance for Cultural and Ethnic Harmony will meet Friday to hear clergyman Bill Freeman, founder of The Journey Church in Holland. The public is invited to the meeting at 7 p.m. at the Center for Women in Transition, 411 Butternut Drive.

In his presentation, "Faith, Inner Faith and Interfaith," Freeman will talk about his efforts "to reach across denominational divisions and religious traditions to discover ways to bring all people of faith, reason and doubt together as one." He said he seeks "to find unity, not uniformity, in diversity, believing that what unites us is greater than what divides us." The focus of his ministry is justice and peace, he said.

After a career in television, radio and magazine publishing, Freeman graduated from Western Theological Seminary in 2005. He served a church in Grand Rapids for a year, and established The Journey Church in 2007. He writes a religion column for The Holland Sentinel and co-hosts a weekly radio show in Grand Rapids.
