Long-time teacher of students with special needs and local resident Jack Hyde will speak at the Friday meeting of the Alliance for Cultural and Ethnic Harmony. The meeting begins 7 p.m. at the Center for Women in Transition, 411 Butternut Drive.

Hyde taught students whose challenges ranged from autism to dyslexia, and teamed with families as an activist and advocate for them within school systems. He taught for 33 years in New Jersey and suburban Chicago and holds degrees in special education from Trenton State College and Northern Illinois University.

He is the author of "Just Another Brick or How I Survived over 8500 School Lunches," about his teaching experiences, and writes a weekly column for The Holland Sentinel.

The Alliance children's group, UNITY, also will meet at the same time and place.
